### Draft social message on gun trauma

What is a faithful Lutheran response when considering U.S. gun culture? The draft of a social message on gun-related violence and trauma probes that question, and your feedback is requested. The draft focuses on trauma, public health and an ethic of shared responsibility for peacemaking, seeking to move beyond the strict polarization of gun rights versus gun control. This is an issue that affects everyone in the United States — let your voice in this process be heard! To participate in the public feedback period, <u>read the draft and use the response form</u>.

## Augustana University Announcement

Augustana University is elated to announce it has received ahistoric \$13.8 million gift to help support students who are active and engaged members of ELCA congregations throughout the Midwest. Thanks to a generous gift from Rosemarie and Dean Buntrock, the university has established the Buntrock Scholars Program.

Over the course of the next decade, the Buntrock Scholars Program will benefit a minimum of 30 students beginning in Fall 2024, and as many as 120 students by Fall 2028. The scholarship will cover half the net price of a selected student's attendance at Augustana up to \$12,000 and be renewable for up to an additional three years to help students cover the cost of a 4-year degree. Interested students must provide a personal statement in applying for this unique and exciting scholarship at Augustana and present a letter of recommendation from their senior pastor or youth pastor. In the event of a pastoral vacancy, the recommendation may come from an elected leader of the congregation.



Many of our alumni have been called to ministry, and countless others are serving as lay leaders within their congregations. This new scholarship opportunity builds on this important foundation.

Registration is open for the 2024 Youth Gathering, Young Adult Gathering, MYLE and tAble. If you have a small group that wishes to attend and would like to travel with others from the Montana Synod, contact Gretchen Mundinger at <u>stjohns@stjohnshelena.org</u> She has already registered a group made up of several congregations, and can add more to the group. She also has the name of a young adult who would like to attend and would like to go with other young adults from Montana, if possible. The Young Adult Gathering is a new thing this year, added because of the number of youth who did not get to attend a Youth Gathering due to Covid. The Young Adult Gathering is being held at the same



time as the Youth Gathering, but at different hotels and has a different agenda. Just prior to the Youth Gathering are 2 other options for youth. MYLE is open to youth of color or whose primary language is other than English. Attendees must be in eighth to 12th grade at registration (fall 2023). A congregational group may attend MYLE if at least half the group are people of color or whose primary language is other than English. If that is not the case, eligible attendees (see previous paragraph) are encouraged to attend with an adult leader and then join their congregational group at the beginning of the Gathering.

the tAble: Youth who are 14 to 18 (or are engaged in a high school youth group or enrolled in high school or the vocational education equivalent) and who live with a wide range of

physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities are encouraged to attend the tAble. Youth who attend must be accompanied by an adult companion. One companion will receive waived registration fees to attend the Gathering following the tAble. The ELCA Youth Gathering has three different brackets for registration: Priority Registration (Sept. 15–Nov. 1, 2023): \$375 Regular Registration (Nov. 2, 2023–Feb. 14, 2024): \$425 Late Registration (Feb. 15–April 15, 2024): \$475

Dates and costs for the Young Adult Gathering are; Priority Registration (Sept. 15–Nov. 1, 2023): \$260 Regular Registration (Nov. 2, 2023–Feb. 14, 2024): \$310 Late Registration (Feb. 15–April 15, 2024): \$360

MYLE and the tAble have a registration fee of \$190; however, thanks to a generous donor, that fee will be waived for the first 1,000 people to register for MYLE and the first 200 people to register for the tAble.

A \$150 nonrefundable, per-person deposit is due at time of registration for the Gathering and Young Adult Gathering and must be paid within the registration rate you expect to pay.

Please note that hotel, meals and travel costs are not included in this registration fee.
