Words From the Bishop -Freed and Renewed in Christ

"Freed and Renewed in Christ: 500 Years of God's Grace in Action" was the theme of the 2016 Churchwide Assembly and Grace Gathering (a y'all come event for ELCA members who wanted to be part of the action in New Orleans.) We had ten voting members at the Assembly-Beverly Bell from Cody. Tammy Bull from Great Falls, Tom



Gossack from Great Falls, Rick Mikkelson from Malta, Alicia Moe from Two Dot, Deb Oldfield from Great Falls, Ben Peterson from Missoula, Carly Tattoo from Wold Point, Brad Ulgenes from Helena, and Bishop Jessica Crist. In addition, Jon Bates from Billings, Fran Gossack from Great Falls and Jayson Nicholson from Frenchtown attended the Grace Gathering.

All who attended said it was a highlight of their church life. So much information about the wider church, such inspiring worship, such important issues to be debated-it was a wonderful opportunity to be church together. An ELCA news release about the Assembly's main actions is included with this week's News. I will highlight a few things.

Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery: At our Montana Synod Assembly we passed a memorial asking the Churchwide Assembly to repudiate the doctrine of discovery, as did 16 other synods. The doctrine of discovery originated as a papal bull declaring that any lands that were not populated by Christians were subject to being conquered. The doctrine, which was embedded into US law in the 19th century, continues to justify the treatment of indigenous people as less than fully human. The Assembly affirmed the repudiation overwhelmingly.

Ecumenical Progress: The Assembly had visitors from a number of Christian Churches, and greetings from both a rabbi and an imam, who expressed gratitude for Lutherans' interreligious commitments. There were 2 significant ecumenical happenings, as well. First was a long-awaited **Declaration on the Way**, an agreement among US Lutherans and Catholics on 32 items that once divided us but no longer do. After the Assembly affirmed the agreement, Presiding Bishop Eaton presented a gift to the Catholic co-chair of the group, Bishop Denis Madden. As he opened the gift and held up the chalice, he said that he eagerly awaits the day when we will drink from the same cup at communion.

The other ecumenical standout was the presence of a number of **Bishops from the AME Zion Church**. We are not in full communion with this denomination, but we are in the process of establishing cordial relations. The Presiding Bishop of the AMEZ, Bishop Battle, preached at one of the worship services, and a group of ELCA Bishops had lunch with the AMEZ Bishops present. During the lunch, when one of my table mates learned there were no AMEZ churches in the whole state of Montana, declared that I must be the "Auxiliary AMEZ Bishop" for Montana. And then, at the end of the lunch, Jesse Jackson dropped by on his way to speak with another part of the Assembly on issues of race and justice.

Each person at the Assembly had a different experience. One evening the Assembly divided up into hearings, and among the hearings attended by our voting members were: Declaration on the Way; Theological Education; On the Way Forward: Called Forward Together; The Campaign for the ELCA; AMMPARO; World Hunger: The Roster of Ministry of Word and Sacrament; Women and Justice. On another afternoon the participants were divided up into experiential learning groups which ranged from Human Trafficking to Anti-Racism to Peace to the Music and Food of New Orleans. I hope that you will invite these folks to your congregations or clusters and learn more about the Churchwide Assembly from them. There are also video clips on our Facebook page, https://www.facebook.com/montanasynodelca/, and on www.elca.org.

The Churchwide Assembly is a triennial event, with the next one taking place in 2019. Be thinking of people you would like to see attend, and watch for Nominating Committee announcements in 2018.

Constitution Updates

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly has passed a number of constitutional changes that affect the Churchwide Constitution, the Synod Constitution, and congregational constitutions. Many of these changes are required, so all congregations will need to adopt them into their constitutions. One of the changes is to replace "ordained minister" with "minister of word and sacrament" wherever it occurs in the constitutions. Another change is to replace "Associate in Ministry, Diaconal Minister and Deaconess" with "minister of word and service."

Our constitutional review team stands ready to assist you, and you can also go to www.elca.org to the Office of the Secretary. We are considering doing a workshop or webinar to assist congregations in reviewing their constitutions.

New Overtime Laws go into Effect in December

New Labor Department regulations may have a significant effect on churches who employ workers below a certain

salary level. Employers (even non-profits) will need to pay overtime to employees who earn less than \$50,000 per year. We are in contact with the ELCA attorneys and our Synod attorney, and will be providing more information in the coming months.



August Newsbrief: Luther and the Anabaptists

As a teenager, I lived in southeastern Pennsylvania, near Lancaster, and saw the Amish people in that area. At the time, I thought they were quaint people in old-fashioned clothes, driving with buggies and horses, and that they made really good food, especially jams, jellies, and pies. I thought they were just local to Pennsylvania and did not realize until years later that they also lived in other places in the U.S. And then I found out that the Amish were part of a larger movement, also springing out of Reformation times, called the Anabaptists. It wasn't until I came to the Montana Synod that I discovered that there was a colony of Hutterites in the area, also part of the Anabaptist movement. This month's newsbrief, "Reformation Neighbors: Lutherans, Hutterites, Mennonites, and Amish", by Paul Seastrand, covers the basic history of the Anabaptist movement, how they divided into different groups, what the characteristics of each group are, and where they settled in North America. I invite you to take a look at the August newsbrief and use it as an introduction to these different groups of people and what they believe. They are much, much more than just their cooking and their horses and buggies!

ELCA Churchwide Assembly Key Actions



Evangelical Lutheran Church in America God's work. Our hands.

CHICAGO (Aug.16, 2016) - Voting members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) approved a number of key actions during the 2016 ELCA Churchwide Assembly held in New Orleans Aug. 8-13. The assembly is the highest legislative authority of the church.

The 945 voting members:

- Elected William B. Horne II of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Clearwater, Fla., vice president of the ELCA. Horne was installed during closing worship Aug. 13.
- Accepted the "Declaration on the Way," a unique ecumenical document that marks a path toward greater unity between Catholics and Lutherans. At the heart of the document are 32 "Statements of Agreement" that state where Lutherans and Catholics do not have church-dividing differences on topics about church, ministry and the Eucharist. The document also presents the differences that remain.
- Approved AMMPARO the ELCA's strategy to Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy,
 Representation and Opportunities. The ELCA developed this strategy based on commitments to uphold and
 guarantee the basic human rights and safety of migrant children and their families; to address the root causes of
 migration in countries from Central America's Northern Triangle and Mexico and the treatment of migrants in
 transit; to work toward just and humane policies affecting migrants in and outside the U.S.; to engage as a
 church with all of its companions, affiliates and partners to respond to the migration situation and its causes; and
 to advocate for migrant children and their families.
- Approved the Ministry of Word and Service roster. Beginning Jan. 1, 2017, ELCA associates in ministry, deaconesses and diaconal ministers will be a single, unified roster of Ministry of Word and Service. The accompanying constitutional amendments related to the roster were also considered and approved by the assembly.
- Approved the 2017-2019 budget proposal. The budget includes a 2017 current fund spending authorization of \$65,296,005 and a 2017 ELCA World Hunger spending authorization of \$24.8 million; a 2018 current fund income proposal of \$64,057,220 and a 2018 ELCA World Hunger income proposal of \$25 million; a 2019 current fund income proposal of \$64,151,175 and a 2019 ELCA World Hunger income proposal of \$25 million; and authorizes the Church Council to establish a spending authorization after periodic review of revised income estimates.
- Approved various memorials or proposals from the ELCA's 65 synods. In addition to memorials considered
 "en bloc," the assembly separately approved the following: deepening relationships with historic Black
 churches; toward a responsible energy future; repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery; peace with justice in the
 Holy Land; justice for the Holy Land through responsible investment; African Descent Lutherans; call to
 discernment on U.S. foreign and military policy; welcoming refugees; and supporting military personnel,
 veterans and their families.
- Elected members to serve on: Church Council, Portico Benefits Services, Mission Investment Fund, Augsburg Fortress, Committee on Appeals, Committee on Discipline and Nominating Committee.
- Adopted amendments to the ELCA Constitution, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions.


Book Signing Opportunity

Greetings from South Africa

Dear friends.

Greetings from Johannesburg, South Africa. We have just returned from 2 months in the US on Home Assignment. It was a fruitful time visiting sponsoring congregations and the opportunity to attend the Summer Missionary Conference in Chicago and see family and friends.

July is midwinter in Southern Africa. It is the dry season but following the failure of two consecutive rainy seasons the current El Niño-induced drought is the worst in 35 years. The severe drought conditions have already taken a serious toll on lives, livestock and livelihoods and the situation could deteriorate further if urgent assistance is not provided.

The devastating drought has affected an estimated 40 million people across region. More than 23 million are in urgent need of humanitarian assistance.

On July 26, 2016 the Southern African Development Community (SADC) declared a Regional Disaster and launched a Regional Appeal for Humanitarian and Recovery Support amounting to US\$2.4 billion.

The Appeal is a formal request to the international community to provide assistance to affected member states. Five member states, Lesotho, Malawi, Namibia, Swaziland and Zimbabwe have already declared national drought emergencies. The Republic of South Africa has declared a drought emergency in 8 of the country's 9 provinces. Mozambique has declared a 90-day institutional red alert for some southern and central areas. (Responding to the Appeal, the United States has pledged US \$300 million, while the United Kingdom and the European Union pledged £72 million Pounds, and €60 million respectively, towards humanitarian assistance.)

Already in May last year the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi led by Bishop Joseph Bvumbwe sent an emergency appeal to the ELCA for support to enable the Evangelical Lutheran Development Service (ELDS) to deliver assistance and support to 22,000 people (4,000 households) in Phalombe and Chikwawa districts with the focus on drought recovery and capacity building activities. ELCA Global Mission was able to send US\$50,000 in response to this urgent request.

From the genealogy to the resurrection, Matthew tells a unique story of the messiah. Matthew's story shares much with both Mark and Luke, but it is finally distinct and fascinating in its own right. In this course we will explore the story Matthew tells. We will look closely at key preaching texts, but we will examine these (and other) key texts in the context of Matthew's whole story. In particular, we will listen throughout the story for echoes of the Slaughter of the Innocents (which enters the story almost as soon as Jesus does). And, because biblical interpretation must always take place in, and for the sake of, the real world, we will listen also for the echoes of the cries of Rachel as she weeps for her children in every century. In all of this, we will aim to discover the kinds of provocations that are useful to preachers who live with this old story for yet another year.
