- We have worked for > 180 congregations and camps in 31 states
- We have constructed > 300+ structures
- Utilization of our program has saved those organizations > \$25 million

- Typically, the sooner we start working with a congregation, the greater the opportunity to save money
- We will build for all ELCA and Common Mission partners
- Over the last 15 years we have granted > \$250,000 to congregations and camps in need
- Together we build structures, community, and faith

### Mission Builders Program


- Work with ELCA congregations, synods, camps and social ministry organizations as they construct or improve their facilities.

- Most people come to the program with some skills but more importantly, a willingness to learn
- One in six builders have had years of experience in construction/construction management and are our "construction project managers"

### What Mission Builders Offers

- Pre-construction planning assistance
- Project / Construction Management
- Architectural services
  - Renderings / elevations
  - Working / construction drawings
- Bid documents and evaluation
- Construction, bringing building to "dried-in" state
  - Framing
  - Setting trusses
  - Sheathing / decking
  - Doors & windows

### Mission Builders Do Not Do

- Foundation / Concrete
- Electrical
- Mechanical
- Plumbing
- Roofing
- Masonry
- Drywall
- Flooring
- Final finish

### Fees / Costs & Savings

- Financial benefits of using Mission Builders, based on past experience, suggest savings of 15 to 25% of cost compared to using a general contractor (GC)
- Elimination of GC performance bond, typical 3%
- Mission Builders fee, \$2.00 \$3.00 per sq foot based on type of construction: new, remodel or gut remodel
- Architectural fee for preliminary design rendering and floor plan, up to final construction drawings \$1,000
- Architect of Record fee for final working drawings, bid documents, etc. (6 – 8%, normally 9 – 10%)
- Mission Builders are employed by the congregation and paid minimum wage
- The congregation will maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance for all employed workers

### Example Timeline - preconstruction

- Retain Mission Builders
- Obtain existing building and site drawings
- Define ministry needs, and look & feel of new building
- Initial kickoff meeting, present / discuss requirements with required parties via conference call (Pastor, building committee, Mission Builder, architect)
- Preliminary program and design study (architect)
  - Rendering / elevations
  - Floor plan
- Review preliminary design via conference call (Pastor, steering committee, Mission Builder, architect)

### Example Timeline - preconstruction

- Pre-Submittal Conference (Planning & Zoning)
- Revise per design review
- Site visit, further design review, verify existing site conditions
- Revise design, start cost estimates
- Final design review and approval
- Prepare final working drawings (6-7 wks)
- Submit for building permit approval (now 2 10 weeks)
- Prepare bid packages, obtain bids, review, select

### Critical Items

- All required permits
- Complete approved construction documents
- Foundation / slab in place before Mission Builders arrive
- Temporary RV hook-ups on site for Mission Builders

### Volunteer Participation

- The church agrees to use its best efforts to recruit volunteers as a building block for the program. As a guideline, volunteer hours typically equal 30%+ of hours worked by Mission Builders. This is only a guideline not a requirement, but many projects have had volunteer levels equaling the hours worked by the Mission Builders.
- As we work and complete a project, we strive to create a volunteer experience that is personally rewarding and a contribution to the congregation and greater community.

### Next Steps

- Submit application
- Pay initial architectural fee \$1000
- Following approval of rendering drawings and the decision to proceed with construction, pay the initial \$3000 fee to engage Mission Builders. This fee will be credited against the per square foot to be paid at milestones during the project.
