National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Native Women and Girls

Today, May 5th, is the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Native Women and Girls. There are currently 170 missing persons in Montana, 30% of which are Native American. This is an astounding number, considering Native Americans only make up 7% of the state's population.

Recently, the Racial Justice Task Force (RJTF) of the Montana Synod was asked to turn our attention to this day by donating gift baskets to a Silent Auction hosted by the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes' (CSKT) Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Work Group. Money raised will be placed in CSKT's "Victim Services Assistance Fund" to help alleviate burdens faced by families as they search for loved ones and cope with devastation and loss.

Together, members of the RJTF "Strategy Team" assembled four different gift baskets entitled

"Made in Montana", "Start Your Morning Right", "A Picnic For Two" and "A Day at the Beach". All items were purchased by Pr. Melanie Martin-Dent, who intentionally purchased items from locally sourced vendors throughout the Flathead Valley. Items totaled just over \$300, supplemented by a few generous donors from the Strategy Team.




Montana Synod Devotion for the Easter Season is Ready to be Distributed in Your Congregation
