




## Words from the Bishop: Synod Office Report

Life is busy in the synod office these days as we prepare for the upcoming synod assembly held in Great Falls on June 2-3. Our time, activities and energy are occupied with preparing documents, finalizing the rooms, food and other venue details with the Heritage Inn, planning worship services,

writing reports, and organizing the many behind-the-scenes pieces involved with putting on an assembly for over 250 people. Just when we feel we've gotten something accomplished, two more things emerge for Colter, Brenda, Peggy or I to turn our attention to.

Two weeks ago we reported that Lori Jara, our office manager for several months, had to quit due to some serious health problems. Please keep her in your prayers as she continues to deal with those issues.



On Monday, we hired a new office assistant, Oliver Main, to help us prepare for the assembly as well as manage the receptionist responsibilities we need to keep the office functioning. Toward Right Relationship with Native Peoples, a program of Friend Peace Teams, offers in-person and online presentations of its workshop "Roots of Injustice, Seeds of Change: Toward Right Relationship with Native Peoples."

In this 2-hour participatory program, we experience the history of the colonization of Turtle Island, the land that is now known as the United States. The story is told through the words of Indigenous leaders, European/American leaders, and Western historians. We engage with this history through experiential exercises and small group discussions. And we are invited to consider how we can build relationships with Indigenous peoples based on truth, respect, justice, and our shared humanity.

This workshop is appropriate for high school students and adults.
