> Words from the Bishop: Some News from Bolivia

Last week I had the joy of visiting with Pastor Presidente Freddy Choque Rondo, the newly elected leader of Iglesia Evangélica Luterana Boliviana, the Bolivian Evangelical Lutheran Church (IELB). Pastor Presidente Rondo, or Pastor Freddy, was elected in May and has been in this new office (which is similar to the bishop's role in the ELCA) for three months. Before becoming the Pastor Presidente of the IELB, Pastor Freddy worked for a state institution as well as serving as a pastor.

Through a translator, he described the work he has been doing since taking office. His primary focus has been connecting with and visiting the 107 congregations and ministries across Bolivia, some of whom are quite remote, as well as spending time in the office getting used to the various administrative tasks of this role.



As he settles into his new role, one of Pastor Freddy's emphases for the IELB is working with the three ministers of the IELB (two of whom are female) to coordinate and provide social, educational and mission support for the many congregations across Bolivia. Like the Montana Synod, the IELB is facing ministry shortages as an older generation of clergy retires and a new generation of clergy and lay leaders is sought for the future of the church. With the help of Pastor Aaron Decker from the Global Missions area of the ELCA, one of the projects they are working on is developing a seminary for theological education of both pastor and lay people. They are also putting together materials for a lay education program somewhat similar to our LPA program.



Pastor Freddy describes the IELB as a church that is changing not only in leadership but in its desire to work with the culture and other Christian denominations toward various social reforms. For example, the IELB just signed a cooperation agreement with World Vision in Bolivia to begin work with the Safe Churches for Children program which seeks to protect children in religious communities and promotes that churches and places are safe environments.

During our conversation, I officially invited Pastor Freddy to visit the Montana Synod at some point in the future and we discussed the possibility of me visiting Bolivia. This conversation is in its earliest stages but when I suggested to him that we could at least meet together in Houston at an upcoming Latin American Consult, Pastor Freddy replied that he'd rather come to Montana! I'd rather show off Montana and Northern Wyoming too!

Please keep Pastor Freddy, the IELB and the people of Boliva in your prayers as they move through this time of leadership transition. Also, if you have interest in serving on a small team of people who can help coordinate our ongoing companion relationship with the IELB, please send me an email.
