

**SUNDAY OF THE PASSION: PALM SUNDAY**      **April 2, 2023**

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**INTRODUCTION**

Today's liturgy begins with a palm procession, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. At the close of worship, the tone of the service changes as we meditate upon Jesus' passion and death. Because this story is so central to our faith, we hear the entire passion reading today from the Gospel of Matthew. Though Jesus is obedient even unto death on the cross, he is exalted by God. We gather to remember his offering for the life of the world, and to be fed by his life-giving mercy. This holy week will culminate in the celebration of the Three Days of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection.

GATHERING

The Holy Spirit calls us together as the people of God

Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

**PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL: Matthew 21:1-11**

The holy gospel according to Saint Matthew,

**Glory to you, O Lord.**

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey." The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee." The gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Today he entered the holy city in triumph and was proclaimed  
messiah and king by those who spread garments and branches along his way.

Grant us grace to follow our Lord in the way of the cross,  
so that, joined to his death and resurrection, we enter into life with you;  
through the same Jesus Christ,  
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

In the waters of baptism you were joined with Christ, reborn as children of God, and anointed with the Holy Spirit. You are free to live as God's people in the world. **Amen.**

### **EPISTLE READING: Philippians 2:5–11**

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death — even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

### **NICENE CREED**
